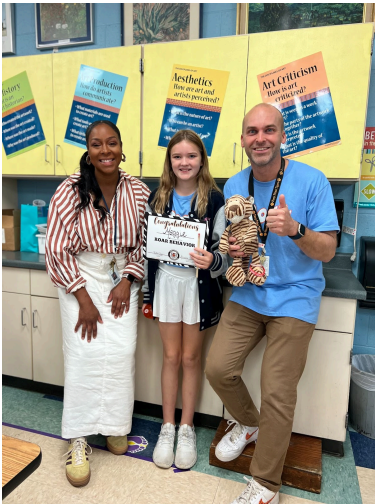

We are starting unit 3 this week: multiplying and dividing whole numbers.

This week, the focus is introducing students to standard algorithm multiplication. Students will be expected to use standard algorithms to solve rather than other strategies (lattice method, box method) that have been used previously, however they are encouraged to use any strategy to check their work.

The quiz will focus on 2×2 , 3×2 and 4×1 multiplication.

Next week we will continue multiplication and work our way to 3×4 and then transition into division.

Essential Question: How do cultural beliefs and values guide people?

Focusing Question: What roles do stories play in Nez Perce culture?

Standards:

- Determine the overall main idea of a text
- Determine relevant and irrelevant details in a text
- Compare and contrast stories in the same genre (e.g., mysteries and adventure stories) on their approaches to similar themes and topics.
- Summarize a text
- Write an informational paragraph

In module one, students will build on their knowledge of the Westward Expansion. We will look at how Native American cultures were similar to other cultures.

This week, we will look at the role stories (legends) played in the Nez Perce culture. We will be listening to the legend titled, Coyote and the Monster to get a better understanding of how stories explained events in Nez Perce culture. Students will be writing comparing this myth to another myth explaining why both were important.

We will also be starting to read our first novel, *Thunder Rolling in the Mountain*. In school, there will be a Youtube read aloud for each chapter if needed. I strongly encourage kids that don't need this to read the book on their own.
